

DID YOU KNOW?(From the Bulletin Board, via Terri)

Nearly every UK family, especially in

Scotland, lost at least one member overseas
(i.e. through emigration) between 1851 & 1951. Young single males formed a high proportion of the emigrants, especially towards the end of the period. The net losses of males through emigration between 1900 & 1913 were more than double the numbers killed during the First World War. This produced a significant 'spinster problem' at the end of the nineteenth century.
