JULY MEETING SCOTTISH RESEARCH..... A good show of hands indicated just how many among us have Scottish roots or connections. Bruce Ralston our guest speaker then did a survey & marked places on a map shown on overhead projection, of the concentration of our research areas. Scottish Civil Registration began in 1855, Bruce says if you have a birth to research in that year, then you are in luck, as the information given was quite extensive, later years are not so detailed. Scottish civil registers are comparible with New Zealand, & contain more information than English ones. As Bruce spent a year & a half working in Scotland as a researcher, he is very well informed on his subject.

Some facts on Scottish Research:


- * A wide range of Scottish records are available in NZ.
- * 1855 about 1900 BDM indexes for Scotland are on microfilm at Family History Libraries.
- * The first 15 20 years of Civil Registration indexes are on the IGI.
- * There are 900 Parishes in Scotland
- * In Aberdeenshire the Monumental Inscriptions are well covered by transcribers.
- * There are probably no surviving Parish registers before 1830 in the Highlands.
- * In our Group Library there is a good range of books on Scotland
- * Dur Microfiche collection holds the following:
 - * Parish maps of Scotland; * County Directory of Scotland;
 - * The New Statistical Account of Scotland, Incl.: Dumbartonshire, Sterlingshire, Selkirkshire, Peebles-shire, Clackmannanshire, Buteshire, Linlithgow, Haddington, & Berwickshire.
 - * Fasti Ecclesie Scoticane (People in the Church of Scotland).
 - * The IGI of Scotland.


