Tallest Family Tree?

A history teacher in Cheddar, Somerset, England, had been introducted to a long-lost ancestor - the 9000 year old Cheddar Man. The teacher, Alan Targett, has been linked by genetic scientists as a direct descendant of the hunter whose skeleton was found in nearby caves in 1903.

A DNA experiment was done involving the staff and pupils of Kings, the school at which Mr. Targett teaches, comparing DNA from a molar of the skeleton with swabs from their mouths. Mr. Targett was "overwhelmed" when told of his close relationship. His ancestors had been farm labourers in the district for many generations (long live the ag.lab.) but he is an only child, married, with no children.
