Ken Skadden of the Wellington Maritime Museum provided a most interesting presentation in our August meeting when speaking on "By Rocks, Fire & Ice". He introduced us to the challenges that faced our ancestors in their journeys from Britain on board the ships bringing them to the New World. Ken used costuming, candle light, and Irish brogue to create the mood, and transport us back into the 19th century and life as a shipwreck survivor. After this introduction he opening up history of navigation and its hazzards with the help of overhead slides.

Medical Terms

Mitral Incompetence - Failure of the mitral valve to close, thus allowing blood to pass back from the left ventricle into the left atrium.

Mitral Stenosis - Failure of the mitral valve to open adequately. This causes congestion of the blood vessels in the lungs.

Mitral Valve - Heart valve between the left atrium and left ventricle. Disease of this valve (mitral stenosis, mitral incompetence) is usually a late effect of rheumatic.
