
In 1783 in Britain a tax of 3d (threepence) was imposed for every entry in a parish register (ie all christenings, marriages, and burials). The tax applied to everyone, regardless of class status. many of the poorer people could not afford the tax and large numbers of others did their very best to avoid it. The effect was an immediate fall off in registrations. Although the tax was revoked in 1794, many parish registers were largely unused during the period of time it was in force - which may help to explain some of the gaps in your research!

More On Irish Research

Joe Cassin reports that he has obtained a series of Microfiche on County Donegal Births, Marriages and Deaths between 1653 and 1899. He also has the fiche index to all these church records, 17 in all.

These have been compiled from a County Donegal card index held by the Queensland Family History Society. The card index was itself compiled by Donegal families over six years from 50 church records and is unique to them. These records were sent to Public Records Office in the 1860s and so not destroyed in the 1922 riots at the Four Courts in Dublin, when so many other records were lost.

The Queensland Family History Society say they will supply a full printout of each entry for a fee.

The Birth Index comprises over 47000 records, Marriages over 22000 and Deaths over 9000 records.

Joe is prepared, for a fee (\$1.50 plus SAE) to inspect his fiche index and supply a photocopy of the Index entry and any details available on full printout from Queensland.

(This fee is for two copies of the printout from index-fiche is made up of 70c plus parking costs, transportation, etc.)

Migration Records South Australia

Did you know that for those migrants who wished to pay their own way to the Australia early in this century, the most popular destination was South Australia?

The reason for this was that the Government of South Australia offered cheaper fares than any other state in Australia.

The Migration Museum, Kintore Avenue, Adelaide, has records of assisted immigrants to South Australia and also some limited information about those who paid their own way. Other information is held at the Maritime Museum at Port Adelaide.
