Putch-Indonesian Genealogy

For the past twenty years, interested parties in the Netherlands have been collecting family history and other pertinent data from displaced perons now living in that country. These are the descendant of Dutch and other European settlers of the former Dutch East Indies who colonized the islands, now called Indonesia. They intermarried with the locals and their

descendants are called Eurasian or Indos.

These Indos were expelled from the country of birth after a 3 1/2 year Japanese occupation and the granting of independence to Indonesia in 1942. Many records were lost during this this transition period. After this painstaking effort, which resulted in the collection of 14,000 dossiers, they called on the Church of Jesus Christ

of Latter day Saints to film their archives. This resulted in 36 micro-films containing important information of this ethnic group. The films are available in Salt Lake, in Holland and is also in the possession of a private party, Dr. Jan A. Krancher. Queensland Deaths

The QLD Registrar-General does not allow access by transcription agents. If you are looking for a Queensland DEATH certificate between about 1900 & 1966 (30yrs ago), it is worthwhile checking the indexes to wills & Public Curator files at Qld State Archives. Most probate files for this century include a copy of the death certificate, which can be photocopied just like any other document in the file. I can send you a list of accredited record agents, if you need work done at Qld State Archives.
