# From The Family History Bookshelf

Griffiths Valuation: Griffith' Valuation of Ireland was an undertaking in the late 1840's and early 1850's and was done as a primary valuation of land and structures on the land. In the valuation records you find the name of the landlord and the renter as well as a description of the property and its taxable income.

Today Griffith's is used primarily as a census substitute given the loss of Irish Census records due to fire and other means of destruction. does not give you the actual makeup of the family, but it does give you the possibility of locating the townland that your family came from, as well as possibly fining other people with the same surname nearby, who might be related.

Griffith's also provides a Householder's Surname Index to both Griffith's and the Tithes that can be used to track the incidence of your surname and on occasion this can locate possible place where your ancestor lived. It also can form the basis for further searches of land records at the Valuation Dept., Dublin. There you can track the possession of land from about 1853 until early 1930s through valuations. It provides also the name of Landowner and the records of cessed through National Li-
