From The Family History Bookshelf

I noticed a great new book when I was at Queensland State Archives, & I quote from the flyer:

"Pathways: Immigration" is the first in a series of guides to records in specific areas of This guide lists records relating to immigration and immigrants. As well as the familiar passenger lists, the guide lists records which are not well known... For example, alien registration during the First World War gives information about people who immigrated as early as the 1860s. Some of the Premier's Department material adds to the twentieth century records of the Immigration Dept.

The book costs A \$15 + \$2 postage, & is available from Qld State Archives, PO Box 3197, Sunnybank Hills QLD 4109.

And while I am on the subject Queensland State Archives guides. They also have a set of Brief Guides. dealing with the sources most commonly used by genealogists: wills, intestacies, electoral rolls, divorces, land records, school records etc. am not sure of the cost of a set of these, but they are not expensive, & well worthwhile for a Family History library.
