Ship = 'OTAGO'

London to Otago - 30 May 1874.

Scale of Dietary for each adult passenger per week.

Preserved Meat:	1 lb.	Molasses (W. India)	1/2 lb.
Salt Beef	1½ lb.	Raisins	1/2 lb.
Salt Pork	1 lb.	Suet	6 oz
Biscuit	31/2 lb.	Pickles	1/4 pint
Flour	3 lb.	Mustard	1/2 OZ
Rice Or Oatmeal	1½ lb.	Pepper	1/2 OZ
Peas	½ pint	Salt	2 oz
Sugar - Raw	1 lb.	Potatoes - fresh	2 lb.
Tea	11/2 oz	Potatoes - preserved	1/2 lb.
Coffee	2 oz	Water	21 quarts
Butter	6 oz	Lime Juice (while in tropics) 6 oz	

Children between 1 & 4 yrs of age to receive preserved meat instead of salt meat every day, and in addition to the articles to which they are entitled by the above written scale, a ½ pint of preserved milk daily, and every alternate day, 1 egg or 2 tablespoons of condensed egg, and 8 oz of arrowroot or sago weekly. Children under 1 year old 3 pints of water daily and if above 4 months old half a pint of preserved milk daily and every alternate day one egg or two tablespoons of condensed egg, also 3 oz of preserved soup, 12 oz's of biscuit, 4 oz's rice and 10 oz's sugar weekly.

BACK TO THE BASICS

Microfiche Handling:

Hold the fiche by the heading and treat like a photograph to prolong its life. Oils and salts in your skin are left on the surface, and will cause it to decay. Remember fiche are used to publish records & books not easily available. In fact some of the <u>fiche</u> of rare titles are themselves out of print.

Kapiti Genealogy Group Library:

You will find the 1870 - 71 NZ Electoral Roll on Microfiche. The central Otago rolls have many miners still hoping for the big pay dirt. The discription of their dwellings is wonderful, Calico, Wood, Sod, Thatch and Iron all feature. Many would later have moved on to other parts of NZ. Check it out! All the eligible voters in the country are listed.

Strays Collection

Strays from the following sources have been added to the Collection since publication of the list which appears in *The New Zealand Genealogist* Jan/Feb 1999 page 24.

- Early NZ Engineers. Engineers born before 1865.
- Flockhouse (Manawatu) boys and girls 1924-1931.
- Otago Daily Times. Births, marriages and deaths 1871.
- Otago Daily Times. Births, marriages and deaths 1874.
- Wellington Tribune 1874-1875. Births, marriages and deaths.

Data submission and research request forms, as well as copies of the Fact Sheet for the Strays Collection, can be obtained by sending a long stamped addressed envelope, quoting your NZSG membership number, to the Strays Officer.

Many entries from the early newspapers include information relating to occupation, military service, whether an obituary has been published and other useful information perhaps not already known to the researcher. Therefore, whether your ancestor is lost or found, a search of the Strays Collection may be beneficial to your research.
