Many years later I had to eat humble pie when I discovered a cup presented by "Capt Robert McKeich" hidden away in the Lawrence Museum and

this was followed shortly after by the discovery of a brief notice in the NZ Gazette which stated that Captain McKeich had resigned from the rank of Captain in the Tuapeka Volunteer Rifles to take up a position as Sergeant Major in the Tuapeka Mounted Rifles. He was reappointed to a commissioned rank of 1st Lieutenant prior to sailing for the Boer War.

Yes, always verify your facts and in this case what my 90 year old cousin remembered was correct.

We are fast approaching the time when, at the next Branch Meeting we will hold the Branch AGM. You are asked to give your earnest consideration to being nominated for a position on the Committee. # **Publishing your Family History**

Our March monthly meeting was a very instructive and well illustrated talk by Branch Member Kay Carter giving suggestions as to how the amateur genealogist might preserve their research for future generations. The following is a précis of her address.

Kay began her address by asking, "How many of you are at the stage of considering producing a book?"

She had produced two family history books and some smaller ones for the family. She commented that she enjoyed the research more than adhering to the discipline of writing a book.

It was necessary to write a book NOW and not leave it until you have finished your research. That never happens. Kay said that it was important to talk to the old people. They can tell so much but always there are more questions left unanswered. Having heard these stories it is also important to verify the stories "No two people have the same memory."

Short stories of family events, plays based on factual information, childhood memories, writing your story and family reunions are all great ways to share your family history. Using modern media such as You Tube, Face Book, DVD's, 8mm film, video, letters, diaries and blogs are all means to be used.

Visiting the places your ancestors left from was important.

"In my case I was not prepared for the feeling (I had) as I drove in Ayrshire and found a coal mine. I had to stop the car and just let the feelings flow over me. I later found out that my father's Fisher grandfather was an iron ore miner and not a coal miner but that is research for you. I had a similar experience when Jim Steele of the Ayrshire Family History Society drove me to Lugar where some of the miners' cottages, now well restored, remain as desirable holiday homes. My Fisher ancestors lived in one of those

houses."

Kay also spoke of the experiences she had when she was researching her Gallaher family in Ireland when having found her great grandfather's shop she may actually have slept in her grandfather's room.

Kay stressed that it was necessary to be very careful who had access to your material and in this day and age consent was vital when publishing dates and names of living persons. Charts which go for more than two pages can be confusing to people who are not genealogists and the spelling of names and places needs to be carefully watched out for.

Chapters in a book are important and Kay considered that the following questions need to be answered:

Who were they?

Where did they come from?

What was it like?

Why did they leave?

How did they get here?

What was it like when they got here?

What did they do?

Followed by personal stories contributed by individual family members about themselves and their ancestors.

Kay went on to discuss costs, the format of a book, use of photographs, binding, editorship, proof reading, indexing, the title cover, EBook and book sales.

Finally Kay asked the question as to where your research material was going. Hers is set to go to the Alexander Turnbull Library.

We hope that the wonderful needlework family tree and quilt made by her daughter go to a safe home.
