NOTES ON NZSG CONFERENCE SPEAKERS

Rosemary Bigwood is a University Lecturer from Edinburgh, Scotland. She is also a lecturer of Scotland & Scottish Family History at Stirling University, Edinburgh University and at conferences throughout Scotland, Great Britain and America (including Salt Lake City, North Carolina & Baltimore). She has published books, contributed articles and made broadcasts.

The other two speakers come from Australia:

Helen Doxford Harris, from Victoria, has a degree in history and was awarded the Order of Australia Medal in 1993 for services to community history. She is an Honorary Life Member of the Australian Institute of Genealogical Studies, a member of the Professional Historians Association, and a founder and honorary life member of the Avoca and District Historical Society. Helen is a popular speaker who has lectured widely and is the author/co-author of three books and numerous articles, and has compiled a number of microflched indexes.

Gary Presland had a career in the Royal Australian Navy, followed by the Australian Merchant Marine, then he studied history and archaeology at universities in Melbourne and London. He worked for some years in the heritage field for the Victorian Government before becoming the Manager of the Victoria Police Historical Unit. Currently he is the Head Curator of the Technology Programme at Museum Victoria

NEWSPAPERS AS RESEARCH TOOLS

Newspapers hold a wealth of information for the Genealogist. In them are Notices of Births, Deaths & Marriages. Shipping movements often had passenger lists in the past, if you are trying to trace when your Forebears came out here. There are also historical events and information, Government policies, as well as business reports, sporting news and many more items of interest.

Indexes of what newspapers are held on microfilm in the Alexander Turnbull Library are available upstairs, giving the years covered, and the microfilms and readers are held in the basement. Then if your required information is found, you can get a printout at a nominal charge, after filling in the required form. I have found the staff, both upstairs and downstairs, very helpful.
