A TREAT IN STORE

We have been fortunate in being able to book Lady Teviot to be our September speaker, during her visit to New Zealand, as she is only over here for a very short time. She comes from Sussex in England and has been involved with Family History Research for thirty years, specializing in Probate Research. With her husband she has compiled the Sussex Burial Index, covering the years 1813 to 1841. Lady Teviot has held several positions in the Federation of Family History Societies and is widely known in many parts of the world for her lectures on many aspects of genealogy, such as Census Returns, Wills, Parish Registers, Medical Conditions in the 19th Century to name a few.

HUTT VALLEY/WELLINGTON BRANCHES RESEARCH WEEKEND, 29-30 June

This was a very full weekend, with talks on a variety of subjects relating to genealogy. As one should always start at the beginning, the first speaker explained procedures for those newcomers to genealogy: collect certificates, check family traditions and verify them. Go back to the original source. The next speaker talked about the National Archives, the National Library and the Alexander Turnbull Library. Another spoke on checking details on Birth, Death & Marriage Certificates (they are only as Then came a talk on "Gavel & Quill", Court Records and good as the supplier of the information). Probates. Family skeletons might be raised through the Police Gazettes or in newspapers. One speaker talked of his research into his wife's Swiss forebears and the thrill they got in going to the area where they came from - one interesting thing about the records was that in the 1700s they were in French while in the next century they were in Latin! Another section was on Irish Roots, while the final speaker talked of the NZSG library index now on computer and available through the Internet. In the other room were the microfiches and readers for NZ BDM and St. Catherine records, Jan Gow had books for sale, someone else displayed things military, while in another comer there were gazetteers where we could look up remote villages tied in with our research. Altogether a most interesting weekend.
