HOROWHENUA PIONEER RIGISTER:

The Levin Genealogy Group has established a Horowhenua Pioneer Register as one of its 1990 Projects. Charts are being distributed throughout N.Z.for descendants of Horowhenua pioneers to fill in and submit for this Register.

The register will be deposited at the Levin Public Library with free access for the public to use. Levin Group have asked that this project be brought to our members attention so they can complete some charts for their own families or give to friends or relatives to complete if they know of anyone from the Horowhenua area. They would also welcome names and addresses of out of town descendants. N.Z. BIRTH, DEATH & MARRIAGE CERTIFICATES

It is best to actually see these certs. for your Family History. It is possible to "sight" the original register entries more cheaply than purchasing a certified copy. We are lucky in this area as we can travel to the Register General in Lower Hutt. (who has records for all of N.Z.) and see these original entries for \$5.50. All that is needed is the year of the event, name, and folio number. Our group has the microfiche records from the Register General and these can be hired plus a reader for three days at a time. From these microfiche you can ascertain that your ancestor is recorded and also obtain the actual folio number. Birth & Death certificates pre 1876 do not have a lot of information on but after 1876 there was a lot more information required and they are of excellent value. For Marriages there was a lot more information required after 1880

N.Z. CENSUS RECORDS Although census records were mostly destroyed, a number of partial census records have survived. Enquire at National Archives. From 1840 to 1853 while N.Z. was a British Colony statistical inform ation was collected for the "Blue Books" of the Colonial Office, but the only people listed by name were civil servants and felons. A N.Z. Company return held at National Archives lists those who died at Wellington during the first five years of settlement. The able-bodied males in Wellington were listed regularly during the 1840's for militia service. Returns list residence and occupation as well as name.

IRISH RECORDS by James G. Ryan - This guide lists available records for Irish Counties in separate chapters for each county. They are listed under the following headings: Brief History, Census & substitutes Church Records, Commercial & Social Directories, Family History, Gravestone inscriptions, Newspapers, Wills & Administrations, Misc, Research Services. It has maps of Parishes & Baronies for each County, sample certificates and transcripts, plus a 51 page introduction which covers all research subjects.

A very usable reference with good clear printing & layout and many addresses for parishes. (Although printed in 1988 I wouldn't presume the priests would still be at the parishes shown and would address any letters to: 'The Parish Priest'.
