ALEXANDER TURNBULL LIBRARY

As a young man, Alexander Turnbull was an avid book collector. His collection eventually rose to 55,000 volumes together with prints, drawings, paintings, manuscripts, maps and photographs. He also gathered Maori and Pacific artifacts as well as coins, but these were later donated to the Dominion Museum to make way for the growing number of his books.

On his death in 1918, Alexander Turnbull bequeathed his collection to the nation, which became the beginning of the Library named after him. It now has more than a quarter of a million volumes as well as thousands of manuscripts, maps, original paintings and drawings, prints, photographs, music and sound recordings

Today the Turnbull Library is a division of the National Library of New Zealand and prints out Fact Sheets on "Oral History Centre" information, "New Zealand newspapers: how to use them for research" "Copying material from the collections" and "Care of Photographs" - there could be more dealing with our early history

AN INDEPENDENT NATIONAL ARCHIVES JUSTIFIES THE EFFORT PUT IN BY GENEALOGISTS

This was the theme of the NZ Society of Genealogists' Vice President's, (Graeme Constable), speech at the quarterly meeting of the Southern North Island Regional Meeting held in Levin recently. The National Archives will now become an independent department from October 1st 2000 instead of being buried as a sub-section within the Department of Internal Affairs.

Had their plans become a reality, the ability of National Archives to manage the preservation of New Zealand's fundamental historical records would have been seriously eroded and the official memories of the country would have been reduced to a minor and insignificant role.

Genealogists fought the move on two fronts. Firstly a legal challenge and lobbying politicians of all parties to highlight the need for an independent National Archives that reported directly to the Government. The NZSG also increased public awareness of the proposals afoot. Thankfully the coalition government have agreed to preserve the National Archives. However, the NZSG will continue to monitor moves to establish the independent department and to put in place the new Archives Act to meet the needs of perserving important records through the 21st century and beyond.
