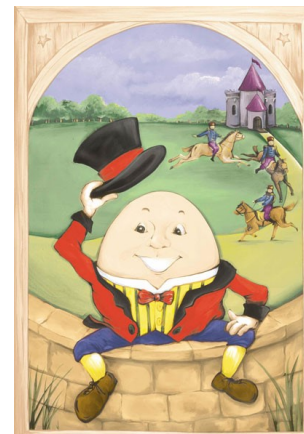

New records of interest

Norfolk Parish Records from **The Genealogist**.

Over half a million parish records for Norfolk containing transcribed records of **Baptism, Marriages and Burials with images** for over 250 parishes. These records include some fascinating **Bastardy bonds, Examinations, Warrants and Orders**. With this release family historians will be able to find:

names of **parents of illegitimate children**

names of **people standing guarantor** for the father baptism, marriages and burials of ancestors in Norfolk.

Findmypast is continuously adding to its collection of records, all of which are available on our computers at the APFHC, so its worth rechecking if there's a record you couldn't find.

This month early American records include those of British Officers serving in America 1614-1787 and Pennsylvanian immigrants 1727-1776. Other additions are British army records and regimental histories and updates to British and Irish newspapers.

Nautical Apprenticeship Records

Some men as young as 14 were apprenticed for up to 6 years to learn the trade of a Merchant Navy seamen. **Findmypast** has **over 300,000 records of Masters and Apprentices** included in a nautical set of apprenticeship records. These National Archives records contain apprentices in the Merchant Navy between 1824-1910.

Ancestry has added (extensive) indexes to the Essex Parish Registers from the Church of England Parish Registers held at the Essex County Council, Chelmsford, Essex, England.

The images however are only available at the Essex Archives site and cost £2.99, or are available as part of a subscription to the Archives

Computer Password at the APFHC

The APFHC computer password changes regularly: check the red Computer Help folder in the top drawer. Keyboards are in the lowest drawer. Please sign the red signing-in book found in the top drawer.

Replace the cover on the computer when you leave and lock the keyboard in the cupboard.

We have wonderful resources on all six of our computers at the APFHC, quite apart from all the other records and books. You are encouraged to use these resources as often as you need.

All six computers have subscriptions to Ancestry, FindMyPast and access to The Genealogist, as well as free sites like FamilySearch (we suggest you use your own log-in to FamilySearch). A microfiche is available. You are encouraged to save the results of your searches on a USB memory stick or send them to your own email address. We have a printer if you wish to print a hard copy. Please put 10c per copy in the honesty box on the cupboard door. Please **do not switch off** the printer.
