Family History talk at the National Library

In Search of Catherine – 'the same grimacing and irrational creature as ever ...'

Alison J. Laurie Research Associate, in Gender and Women's Studies VUW and Valerie E. Davison knew nothing of the lives of their paternal great-grandparents William and Catherine Lawry other than that they had emigrated from Cornwall to New Zealand in 1864.

The first cousins then began a search to complete the family records - and found a wealth of startling information, which was available from official sources, demonstrating how even carefully hidden secrets leave a written trail through state records.

They found that their great-grandmother Catherine Lawry was committed in 1873 to Sunnyside Lunatic Asylum in Christchurch, and remained in asylums until her death in 1923. She spent over 50 years as a patient in the lunatic asylums of early New Zealand, never seeing her husband or her 5 children again.

This week they not only fixed their extremely odd match reporting, but also gave us many more matches, AND a chromosome browser. If only Ancestry would follow suit on the latter! With the phenomenal growth reported by MyHeritage DNA testing over the last year, they will be giving Ancestry a run for their money.

What many don't realise is that it is completely free to transfer between FamilyTreeDNA's FamilyFinder and MyHeritage.

So get the best of both worlds. Test at FamilyTreeDNA to get your sample on file and able to be upgraded to the other more specialised tests available there, and fish in the match pond at MyHeritage for free. Not forgetting to upload your file to GEDMatch.com to fish over there for those from Ancestry.

Alison Proctor Family History Centre

The APFHC is located at Paraparaumu Library . Turn right inside the library entrance and at the far end you'll see the six computers, microfiche and library. The cupboard on the right hand side of the area contains the red folders mentioned below.

Computer Password at the APFHC

The APFHC computer password changes regularly: check the red Computer Help folder in drawer 5. Members need to get the cupboard key from the library Welcome desk. Please sign the red signing-in book found in the drawer. Replace the cover on the computer when you leave and lock the keyboard in the cupboard.

We have wonderful resources on all six of our computers at the APFHC, quite apart from all the other records and books. You are encouraged to use these resources as often as you need. They are the envy of other Genealogy Societies.

All six computers have subscriptions to Ancestry, FindMyPast and access to The Genealogist, as well as free sites like FamilySearch. A microfiche is available. You are encouraged to save the results of your searches on a USB memory stick or send them to your own email address. We have a printer if you wish to print a hard copy. Please put 10c per copy in the honesty box on the cupboard door. Please **do not switch off** the printer.
