Calling Scottish researchers!

Findmypast, is marking the 260th Anniversary of the birth of Robert Burns, the national poet of Scotland, with the release of almost 700,000 new Scottish records.

Over 275,000 new records have been added to Findmypast's collection of more than 2 million **Catholic Sacramental Registers records**. Covering all eight Scottish Dioces, fully indexed and scanned in full colour, these important documents can't be found anywhere else online.

Almost **75,000 records from the Jacobite rebellions of 1715 and 1745** have been digitised from The National Archives and are now searchable for the first time, forming an expansive collection of assorted documents including lists of prisoners and those banished or pardoned along with correspondence, commission records, briefs of evidence and more.

Over 30,000 records of **Glasgow smallpox vaccinations from 1801-1850**, indexed and available with images of the original documents have been added from the library of the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Glasgow.

These cover the very poorest parts of the city, and may be some of the only records that survive for many of these individuals.

From the same archive, come documents relating to almost 2,000 newly indexed names taken from class rolls of those who studied Anatomy under Professor George Buchanan **at Anderson's College, Glasgow from 1860-1874**.

Over 280,000 new burials from cemeteries across Glasgow have joined our **Glasgow & Lanarkshire Death & Burial Index**. These valuable records have been supplied by the latest Scottish family history society to partner with Findmypast, the **Glasgow & West of Scotland Family History Society**.

'Getting it right'

Starting your family history can be daunting! **Getting It Right** is a series of learning resources with a New Zealand focus to help with your family history research.

These have been created by Sarah Hewitt, Convenor of Kilbirne Branch who was commissioned by NZSG with help from a grant from the Wellington Masonic Club.

Although aimed at genealogists who are new to genealogy, these resources are of value to all genealogists as it is always good to refresh your research techniques.

In these presentations you can discover practical steps and tips you can take to start on the fascinating story of your family.

Each resource consists of a video and a set of notes. There are 11 videos, each around 8 to 10 minutes long. So you can pick and choose what you learn, or if you are an absolute beginner, you can start from the beginning and work your way through to get the best introduction to Genealogy and your research journey.

The resources are available through the N.Z. Society Genealogists website. Go to the NZSG home page www.genealogy.org.nz and click on the Getting it Right logo.

You do not need to be a NZSG Member or sign in to access these.

They are available to view on YouTube and you can click through to our YouTube channel from the title of each of the videos.

School Admissions Registers project

Quarterly Progress Report on the Schools Admissions Registers Project of the Kapiti Genealogy Group, assisted by Waikanae genealogists, for the first quarter of 2019.

We have transcribed all the available data from schools in the area that have given consent. Our efforts are now concentrated on checking the transcribed data against the original registers, and correcting any errors that are found. If no further schools consent, the current project will end when all the data we have, has been checked and corrected.

Below is the progress made on each school:

Paekakariki School	Project 4640 1849 Records completed and passed to NZSG
Raumati Beach School	Project 4639 3357 Records completed and passed to NZSG, 5 Apr 2017.
Waikanae Primary School	Project 4641 7747 Records completed and passed to NZSG, 9 Apr 2018.
Paraparaumu Beach School	Project 4643 1965 – 2015 transcribed, 1965 – 2011 checked, 1965 – 2000 edited.
St Patricks School	Project 4651 2005 – 2015 transcribed. Some records are being checked.
Kapanui School	Project 4645 1978 – 2015 transcribed. Some records are being checked.
Kenakena School	Project 4653 1978 – 2010 transcribed. Checking is yet to start.

The APFHC is located at Paraparamu Library . Turn right inside the library entrance and at the far end you'll see the six computers, microfiche and library. The cupboard on the right hand side of the area contains the red folders mentioned below.

Members need to get the cupboard key from the library Welcome Desk, when you will be asked to show your membership card.

Computer Password at the APFHC

The APFHC computer password changes regularly: check the red Computer Help folder in the top drawer. Keyboards are in the lowest drawer. Please sign the red signing-in book found in the top drawer.

Replace the cover on the computer when you leave and lock the keyboard in the cupboard.

We have wonderful resources on all six of our computers at the APFHC, quite apart from all the other records and books. You are encouraged to use these resources as often as you need.

All six computers have subscriptions to Ancestry, FindMyPast and access to The Genealogist, as well as free sites like FamilySearch (we suggest you use your own log-in to FamilySearch). A microfiche is available. You are encouraged to save the results of your searches on a USB memory stick or send them to your own email address. We have a printer if you wish to print a hard copy. Please put 10c per copy in the honesty box on the cupboard door.

Please **do not switch off** the printer.
