

HOLIDAY BRIDES.

Couples Marry in Batches on Easter Monday.

There was much rejoicing and a great display. of finery at St. George's the Martyr, in the Borough, yesterday. Easter time is wedding-time for many of the poor of London, and some score of happy young folk joined hands and fortunes at this church on Monday morning. The neighbourhood made much of the event.

The church and the street outside were crowded with friends and relatives, and casual, but in-

terested onlookers, men, women, and children, were bravely attired in holiday clothes. They cheered when those about to be wed, blushing, gorgeously-attired brides and basinin bridegrooms arrived. These belonged to many classes-soberly attired working-men and girls, and costers and their donahs in gorgeous raiment.

Feathers and Flowers.

The interior of the gloomy church was decorated with spring flowers, but these blossoms paled before the brilliant costumes of many of the brides and bridesmaids. White-feathered has shone bright, and lilac and purple gowns gave additional colour to a picturesque scene. The bridegrooms, who for the most part favoured black short coats The bridegrooms, and check trousers, made an insignificant show amidst this finery.

There was at times quite a crowd round the altar rails, for at such times couples are joined is batches, and after some of the ceremonies there was confusion. The brides, as usual, seemed self-possessed enough, but the experienced verger had much ado to persuade the nervous, agitated bridegrooms into the vestry for the necessary signatures.

One-Day Boneymoon.

But all was brought to a happy conclusion. Bride and bridegroom, smiling uneasily, came out one after another, and then came the opportunity for the waiting crowd. The happy couples were smothered in confetti, and Cockney jest and laughter were the order of the day. Then the newly-wedded escaped, some, it is said,

to spend their one may's noneymoon on Hampstead Heath.

Mass Weddings

In the past many people worked a seven day week, and until late at night. Christmas Day was therefore the day for weddings, because it was a whole day's holiday followed by another one. Occasionally this was followed by a Sunday.

This resulted in en masse weddings. About five pairs at a time stood at the altar rail as the parson passed along the row. Then the bridal couple and witnesses paraded in turn to the Vestry to sign the register and left the church making way for the next group.

St George the Martyr parish in North Southwark was in a densely populated area and had mass weddings. Between the years 1891-1941 the numbers of pairs varied from three to twenty nine. The practice ceased by 1942.

Alison Proctor Family History Centre

The APFHC is located at Paraparaumu Library . Turn right inside the library entrance to the area containing six computers, microfiche and library. The cupboard on the right hand side of the area contains the red folders mentioned below.

Members need to get the cupboard key from the library Welcome Desk, when you will be asked to sign for the key and show your membership card for the current year.

Computer Password at the APFHC

The APFHC computer password changes regularly: check the red Computer Help folder in the top drawer.

Please sign the red signing-in book found in the top drawer.

Keyboards are in the lowest drawer.

Replace the cover on the computer when you leave and lock the keyboard in the cupboard.

All six computers have subscriptions to Ancestry, FindMyPast and access to The Genealogist and Roots Ireland as well as free sites like FamilySearch. (Use your own log-in to FamilySearch).

NB. Please do **NOT** sign out of RootsIreland, FindMyPast or TheGenealogist.

A microfiche is available and there are books on a variety of topics which can be borrowed. Boxes of copies of 'Who do you think you are' and 'Family Tree' are on the shelf. The Paraparaumu library also has copies of 'Family Tree' on their magazine shelves.

You are encouraged to save the results of your searches on a USB memory stick or send them to your own email address.

We have a printer if you wish to print a hard copy. Please put 10c per copy in the honesty box on the cupboard door.

Please **do not switch off** the printer.


