Past Convenors remember

Highlights from my years as Convenor 2001-2003

When I took over as convenor in 2001, much work had already been done by others towards moving the branch research material into the soon-to-be-opened new Paraparaumu Library. I became involved in the discussions with library staff and we soon had a firm plan in place to move our meetings to a committee meeting room at the library. The greater exposure of the group as a result of the relocated research material (not to mention weekly help in the research area for anyone interested in their genealogy) as well as the bright, modern meeting venue, resulted in a sudden rise in membership. So great was that rise that we had soon to find a bigger meeting space!

My involvement with the Schools Admissions Project took place in two quite separate periods of time. Initially the project had been handled by Deborah Shuker. I took over organizing the project in 1998, and with the assistance of about a dozen volunteer members, finished the Paraparaumu and Paekakariki schools around 2000. In 2003 I resigned from the group to devote more time to my job.

Following the fire at the Paraparaumu School in 2014, I was contacted by Bill McKeich to join him in handing over a CD copy of our transcribed data to the school, who were soon to have a reunion. Their school records had all been lost in the fire. Following the handover, I told Bill I intended rejoining the group and we agreed that I would restart the Schools Project. This time around, Bill and 23 others did the transcribing of many thousands of records. Bill also had a great rapport with school principals which was key in getting the approval of each to transcribe their data. The real heroes of the project are those 24 members.

During my role as convenor of the Kapiti Branch I became interested in School Pupils' Records mainly due to tracking down the movements of some members of my own family.

The project received a boost when tragically a fire at Paraparaumu Primary School destroyed all their records. Fortunately, in previous years a Schools Records Project lead by John Glover had recorded records of 1889 to 1978. These had been submitted to the New Zealand Society and in August 2014 a presentation was made to the school with those records recorded on a CD.

Following this, John and I agreed that he would manage another round of the project. My role was to liaise with individual schools and the local Principals' Group and assist with recording information from School Registers of Admission and Withdrawal prior to forwarding them to NZSG.

Our 30th Anniversary was coming up and I had the privilege of presenting former Convenor, Clive Palmer with a Life Membership in the Society.

To see the content of the private Group you have to belong to it. Only the Group is open for discussions. The Group is not restricted to Kapiti Genealogy members. Once you join, you are free to comment, post and continue to belong to a friendly community of like minded individuals interested in genealogy sharing their tips and genealogy news.

NZSG Shipping Records Project

We are excited to announce the launch of The NZSG Shipping Collection.

Our aim is to collect ALL shipping records into one single database. At the moment shipping records are spread out over multiple different websites and platforms. By combining these all into one single database, many missing ancestors will be found. The final database will include immigration and emigration records, including Trans-Tasman and Coastal Shipping.

This project will be phased over several years.

Phase One is collecting names of Members/Branches/Interest Groups to help with the project. Can you help? Can your Branch/Interest Group help? There will be multiple roles involved in the project so please register your interest now. Remember just an hour a day, an hour a week or an hour a month all make a difference.

Phase Two is about creating the largest database of ships arriving to, departing from, and travelling around the ports of New Zealand. We have to know the ships we are looking for before we move onto gathering the data about each ship. The collection will include all ships found up to and including 1920. To make this list manageable the years will be split into decades (or five-year blocks). This is where Branches and Interest Groups can help. Can your group manage a block of records? Full instructions will be given including templates to record the data.



Computer Password at the APFHC

The APFHC computer password changes regularly: check the red Computer Help folder in the top drawer.

Please sign the red signing-in book found in the top drawer.

Keyboards are in the lowest drawer. Replace the cover on the computer when you leave and lock the keyboard in the cupboard.

All six computers have subscriptions to Ancestry, FindMyPast and access to The Genealogist and Roots Ireland as well as free sites like FamilySearch. (Use your own log-in to FamilySearch).

NB. Please do **NOT** sign out of Rootslreland, FindMyPast or TheGenealogist. Please **do not switch off** the printer.

A microfiche reader is available and there are books on a variety of topics that can be borrowed. Boxes of copies of 'Who do you think you are' and 'Family Tree' are on the shelf.

You are encouraged to save the results of your searches on a USB memory stick or send them to your own email address.

We have a printer if you wish to print a hard copy. Please put 10c per copy in the honesty box on the cupboard door.
