HUTT VALLEY BRANCH. In its latest newsletter, they announce *HAPPY BIRTHDAY From* the Ancestors in celebration of their 20th anniversary! What an exciting newsletter it is Part 2 of their party has some of their foundation members as speakers and everyone bringing a plate for the party. It sounds great! How old are we? Further on they give a timeline, going back a long way further than the 20 years, in fact to 1793 when the first free British settlers arrived in Australia. Then they announce the NZSG Education Day at the Hutt Bridge Club Rooms on 12th April with Sherry Irvine, a Canadian who specialises in British Isles research and has written two books and numerous articles. She is currently President of the Assoication of Professional Genealogists. She will be presenting 3 papers at the Australasian Congress in Melbourne and will be briefly touring NZ beforehand. In fact she will be in Lower Hutt (details in "The New Zealand Genealogist" but numbers are strictly limited and pre-booking is necessary (through NZSG). Morning Session is "Foundations for Irish Research" and Common pitfalls' while in the afternoon "Carefully spending your internet dollars" and in the evening "Old Data - New Insights: using census reports to look at the social history") Cost is \$25 for each day session, with a reduced cost of \$40 if you book both day sessions. The evening session is \$5. This is the only NZSG Education Programme to venture South of the Bombay Hills! Anyone interested? I will be unable to go, even if there are spaces available, but I would love to get a report on it for our next newsletter.

Via the WAIRARAPA BRANCH: from Bill Orange comes the following story:-
