NAMING IN NORWAY

Haagen Nielsen Hofstad and Ingeborg Olsdatter's daughter, Sigrid, was christened 8th November 1820. The witnesses were Niels Haagensen Hofstad, Anders Nielsen Ingstad, Sigrid Olsdatter 0slkil, Berit Olesdatter S0mes and Ollaug Josefsdatter Fordal Hofstad. Hofstad, Ingstad, Oslkil, S0rnes and Fordal are all farm names.

Often a farm or place name was added, but if that person moved to another farm, he could then drop the first farm name and be called after the new one!
