GENEALOGICAL RESEARCH DIRECTORY

Past contributors will have received a notice from the editors by now to say it is time to send in information for the 2002 Directory. For those of you who do not know, this can be a valuable tool for contacting other people around the world who are researching the same names. Sometimes they link up with YOUR family, sometimes not, but either way it provides information you can pick up as another piece of your jogsaw, or discard as belonging to another person's puzzle.

Much of the Directory is taken up with lists of surnames, with the countries/areas and time frames that the enquirers are looking at. Here they are identified by a Contributor Number and a list of these, in numerical order, is found in another section of the book. Another part deals with subjects, such as Migration, Military, Places, Shipping, etc. Those making the enquiry are again identified by the same number as above. Then there are the One Name Studies section, where the researchers are only following up one ancestor.

At the back of the Directory are Genealogical Societies and Archives, again from the countries of the world. I have found these very helpful when trying to research long-distance.

GOING UPI Have you heard that the Registrar of Births, Deaths and Marriages are putting up the fees on their certificates and photocopies of certificates? We are invited to show our disapproval by writing to George Hawkins, M.P., Minister in Charge, to protest this excessive price hike, sending copies to our local M.P.s as well Another option is to join a nationwide boycott and not purchase any certificates until the prices are reduced Sue Greene from the NZSG suggests that all 8000 NZSG members photocopy the BDM certificates that they have

collected ar.d send them to NZSG headquarters, who will then index them and add to their CD-ROM, as members this is a free service to which wel will have access. NZSG has been in touch with the Registrar's Office, who have stated there was no room for discussion and Sue has e-mailed George Hawkins to get the justification for these increases, asking that this is made public in the newspapers. She intends to keep on pestering him until she gets an explanation.

These records, so important to New Zealanders* research, is not only a part of our personal history, but also part of our country's history. From \$9 for an 'Information Only" copy to \$33, putting it in line with a complete certified copy is too much. Don't you agree?

SEARCHING C OF E CHURCH REGISTERS

For anyone wishing to search Church Registers in Britain which are still held at the Church, the current fee scale set by the Church of England is as follows:-

- * Searching registers of marriages for the period before 1st July 1837 for up to 1 hour = \pounds 13 UK and for each subsequent hour or part of an hour \pounds 11 UK
- * Searching registers of baptisms or burials (including the provision of one copy of an item therein) for up to one hour = £13 UK and each subsequent hour or part £11 UK
- * Each additional copy of baptism or death entry £13

The search fee relates to a particular search where the approximate date of the baptism, marriage or burial is known. The fee for a more general search of a church register would be negotiable.

It is suggested that you first find out what records are held at the pertinent Public Record Office, e.g. For Somerset Record Office go to www.somerset.gov.uk select learning
