Convener's Comment:-

A personal plea

Four years ago I attended an AGM as a relatively new member of the Branch and the Society and came home as the Convener! Yes, it's the classic story of why you shouldn't go to an AGM. But in hindsight I have no regrets. I accepted the challenge and have been privileged to work with a group of like minded Committee Members, Appointed Officers and supporters who have helped us develop the Kapiti Branch into one of the largest in the country.

In doing so we have *inter-alia*, forged a tremendously successful partnership with the KCDC Libraries begun by our predecessors; have received nearly \$20,000 worth of grants to expand our research resources and support facilities; launched a website and upmarket newsletter; developed a programme that extends beyond just a monthly meeting to include a weekly

help session at our research facility, visits to local data repositories; an improved Help desk and the KapitGenForum research finder; frequent update mail outs of forthcoming activities; four special interest groups; specialised research sessions and public EXPOS; a publicity and marketing schedule; a smarter internal financial and corporate management process; and regular interaction with our national body to try and obtain greater recognition of the major role branches play as a community grouping. In this period our membership has almost doubled.

However not all is well. The cruel statistic is that with a membership that for the last 2 years has been of the order of 220, only around 10% of the membership has been actively involved in any form of continuing support role. The reasons are varied – our lives whether in so-called retirement, with work, health, personal and family commitments or whatever, are involved and intense. Nevertheless, if we are to continue to provide the wide range of support concomitant with a large membership with an equally large range of family research interests and needs, we desperately need your help. New blood is needed to refresh the ideas and further the advances made.

As the 2007 year draws to a close and our AGM looms in October, we are in a critical state. Ideally the Committee should be around 10 persons. We have managed with 8 this year and lost Alison Procter early last month. 2 members have decided they will not stand again next term. For most of the 6 remaining, myself included, we are prepared to stand again for one term only but on the condition that we have newcomers who can understudy our roles and bring a fresh perspective. There is safety in numbers because the more Committee and off-committee appointments we have, the more we can spread the responsibilities.

You DO NOT have to be a (so-called) experienced family historian – whatever that is! It is simply your interest and ideas. Sure you came to Kapiti to escape the school/work/other committees you had been on! But this is a hobby scenario and the pressure is very different. We are very relaxed and laid back. So PLEASE, be brave & make a commitment like I did. If you can help us in general admin, publicity, finance, websites, newsletters, library, computers, sales, research, programming, projects or simply your ideas and interests, put your name forward. There are heaps of opportunities on and off the Committee. Please give me a call if you would like to talk this through. **Clive Palmer**

Membership matters

Negotiations by the Society in regard to the new charities registration legislation covered in the July newsletter continue. We have indicated to national headquarters that the Branch wishes to seek registration for charity and tax free status. To pre-empt what we believe will be a more rigorous audit trail of membership in future, we have introduced a 2-tier system for the 2007-2008 financial year. You will note this change on your new membership card. Those who belong to NZSG will be **Members** of the Branch, while those who do not belong to NZSG will be **Associates.**

Should an Associate join the Society during the year then their status will obviously change. This seems to be a pattern being adopted by several other Branches. It is a naming process only and does not mean any lesser or greater access to our resources and activities. Nor does it change, only clarifies the current constitutional fact that the Branch is a legally identified body of a national organisation. Only *Members* can be on the Committee and vote at General Meetings, while *Associates* can participate in the many other offcommittee and support tasks required to keep the Branch up and running. We are unlikely to have any further feedback from the national body until after Council meets in November. **Clive Palmer**

The new website is designed to be a little friendlier to people with slow connections and bandwidth limits. The images are scaled down before they are displayed, and sometimes only the articles need to be sent (rather than the whole page), so less bandwidth is needed to see the page images. While this is nice for people on slow connections, people on fast connections are noticing longer image loading times (they have to wait while the images are scaled down). We have also noticed that search result pages are slower than we would like. We are currently working on these issues.
