Update on the Schools Admission project

This is the report for the first quarter of 2017.

In the current round of transcriptions (as distinct from those we did a dozen or more years ago) we have so far completed Paekakariki and Raumati Beach Schools, up to the end of the year previous to copying the registers.

Waikanae Primary School will be the next to be completed. Transcribing is already complete, and checking is completed from 1896 – 1980. Editing of the checked data is completed from 1896 to 1930.

Paraparaumu Beach School will follow that. Transcribing the data (1965 – 2015) is complete. Checking and editing yet to start.

Schools no longer use the 'old' registers? They now use various forms (it's up to the individual school what they chose) of computerised database. Printing these out doesn't give us the range of data as previously, so the new data will be less useful to genealogists. We're doing the best we can with the 'modern' data.

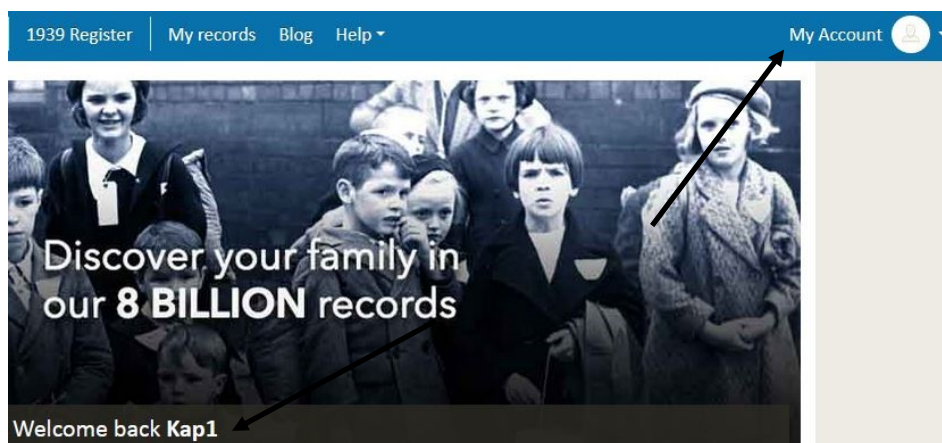

“Find My Past” and “The Genealogist” login problems

Both the “Find My Past” and “The Genealogist” subscriptions on the APFHC computers belong to our Kapiti Genealogy group, and for them to work, they have to be signed in.

Normally, the ‘Remember Me’ function on the browser does just that, and automatically signs you in. You can check whether you are signed in by looking at the top right-hand side of the screen.

In **FMP**, it will say “My Account”, as well as showing a welcome message.



If you are **not** signed in, you will

see **‘Sign In’**. If this is the case, simply click on “Sign in” and you will be presented with a form to fill in. If the form is completely empty, just type the letter ‘K’ into the Email address box and the full remembered email address should appear, along with the encrypted password: Now click “Sign in” and you should be back in action.

Similarly, for **The Genealogist**. Simply click on the ‘Sign in’ button and you should see the fully populated email address and password. You can now Sign In.

If you continue to have a problem, try one of the other computers – they all seem to behave slightly differently.

The overall exhibition utilises specifically selected images with audio tapes of extracts read from diaries. This dynamic exhibition portrays the afflictions and hardships New Zealand servicemen received during the many conflicts over the four-year three-month war.

All six computers have subscriptions to Ancestry, FindMyPast and access to The Genealogist, as well as free sites like FamilySearch. A microfiche is available.
